# Prepare the Body

#### Musculature

- stretch arms pull across torso
- back roll down to floor and slowly back up
- neck ear toward shoulders,
   chest, chin to ceiling (add a pout)
- shoulders scrunch up and fall
- shoulder roll big and SLOW

#### Posture

- feet slightly apart, under hips/shoulders
- knees slightly bend, not locked
- spine aligned like a tower of blocks - neck is part of the spine
- head balanced on the top of the spine
- arms gently hanging
- feeling of being a marionette

### Prepare the Breath and Mind

#### Breath

- unvoiced consonants
- in through nose, out on "s"
- in through "oo" shape (feel the cool air), out on "oo"
- train and whistle or basketball and shoot
- throw the frisbee
- lip trill 5th, slide up and down



- "vowel train" as described by Derrick Fox






Engage through performance techniques and repertoire choices.

Engage through emotional and social connections.



Demonstrating foundation of past learning, are the students able to identify basic elements?

pitches

key signatures

meter signatures

rhythms dynamic markings



Demonstrating foundation of past learning, are the students able to demonstrate understanding and apply past learning?

identify melody in various voice melodic contour interpretation text pitch relationships tend center relationships



Demonstrating past and current learning, are the students able to show ability and apply knowledge? Are they becoming independent musicians?

perform accurately musicianship artistic elements



Are the students able to analyze the score? How does the music apply to the vocal lines/texture of the work?

intentional and artistic performance
interaction of voice parts
form, key changes. tempo changes
How these effect the interpretation and performance



Are the students showing growth in understanding, interpretation, musical decisions? Are they able to create?

Help develop program order -what story are we telling? Engage in ideas about how to creatively transition from one piece to another?

Incorporate past repertoire that may work well?



Spend time to debrief with the choir. Unpack every performance.

Students offer evaluations and feedback before teacher offers theirs.

Frame the conversation around positivity and constructional evaluation.
